From the Mayor's Desk....

CAREER TRANSITION WORKSHOP PLANNED

A NEW \$175,000 NJDOT GRANT ANNOUNCED

This month, the Borough of Harrington Park was informed that our grant application in the amount of \$175,000 has been approved for 2010. The grant will be used to improve the Harrington Park Transportation Hub, commonly known as our park and ride lot. The quarter-mile distance will run from Schraalenburgh Road to LaRoche Avenue.

This location has been used for years by residents who travel each day into New York City. The project was considered one of the best submitted this round and will greatly improve a heavily used location.

RE-EXAMINATION REPORT OF OUR MASTER PLAN FOR HARRINGTON PARK APPROVED

A Planning Board sub-committee headed by David Spatz has presented a report that consists of: (a) a review of the Borough of Harrington Park's land development objectives as stated in the last re-examination report; (b) the extent to which such objectives and problems have been decreased or increased; (c) any significant changes in the objectives since the adoption of the master plan and last re-examination report; (d) any recommended changes to the master plan or development regulations based on this review; and (e) any recommendations concerning the incorporation of redevelopment plans into the land use element of the master plan and recommended changes, if any, in the local development regulations necessary to effectuate the redevelopment plans.

A public hearing on the report was held on Tuesday, October 13, 2009. Following the hearing, the report was approved by the Planning Board and is available for your review at Borough Hall.

WE NEED YOUR COOPERATION

During the fall leaf pick-up season, we really need your cooperation. Please do not add grass clippings to your leaf piles. This limits the effectiveness of the D.P.W. operation. In addition, please do not include items such as tree branches or materials that will slow down the process. If you have a lawn care company working on your property, they are required to remove the grass clippings as opposed to mixing them with the leaves. If you notice any type of violation being committed please notify us immediately. If your lawn care company is not complying with our ordinances please let them know what is required.

GOVERNMENT DAYS A BIG SUCCESS

On October 9 and October 14, we hosted the third and fourth grade students of Harrington Park School at Borough Hall. On October 9 the third graders were introduced to the activities of the Police Department, the Department of Public Works, the Fire Department, and the Ambulance Corps. Representatives from each organization provided the students with a "hands-on" presentation of what goes on in each area. On October 14 the fourth grade class was presented a program that included: a representative from Congressman Garrett's office; N.J. Assemblyman John Rooney from District 39; County Executive Dennis McNerney; County Freeholders Julie O'Brien and Vernon C. Walton; a representative from the County Police Department; and Harrington Park Council Members Thomas Betancourt, Mary Dunlea, and Greg Evarella. Each student was supplied with information related to all of the levels of government represented.

In both cases, I believe the students left Borough Hall with a better understanding of how government works as well as an appreciation of the importance of personal involvement in the process.
