From the Mayor's Desk....

SENATOR BOOKER HOSTS CSX MEETING

Harrington Park's "favorite son," US Senator Cory Booker, accepted my request to host a meeting regarding safety reforms along the CSX rail lines running through the Northern Valley area. The Mayors of Bergenfield, Dumont, Harrington Park, Haworth, Northvale, Norwood and Teaneck met at the Senator's Newark office. We were joined by NJ Senator Loretta Weinberg, County Executive James Tedesco and Freeholder Tracy Zur.

We left the meeting satisfied that Senator Booker is both supportive of our requests, and willing to work toward federal legislation that would improve safety conditions along the CSX line. Senator Booker's willingness to help is critical since federal law controls activity along the line which runs through many of our counties.

We are seeking stronger safety measures, including the speed of the trains and conditions at each crossing. Better communications between all levels of government is also a concern. Safer tank cars were also requested. We also discussed increased funding for training sessions for our first responders.

All of those present agreed, that by working together, we can hopefully avoid future problems while we prepare plans to deal with any situation that might develop.

You should also know that CSX continues to work with us by increasing their inspections of the line, as well as, improving the infrastructure of the system. I'll keep you posted as to our progress.

HAPPENINGS IN AND AROUND HARRINGTON PARK

In addition to our normal month to month activities, the Mayor and Council are involved with the following events and programs:

- ◆ Using a grant in the amount of \$149,000 from NJDOT to repair various sections of Lynn Street.
- ◆ Sidewalk crossing by the Harrington Park Swim Club that included concrete curbing, sidewalks, ADA ramps, roadway striping and solar signage. Funds were received from an NJDOT Discretionary Aid Grant.
- ◆ Plans to install generators at the Borough Hall and DPW from grant money from the Flood Hazard Mitigation Program in the amount of \$75,000.
- ◆ The Riverside Cooperative Program recently enabled the Borough to repave Highland Avenue, Martin Drive and Manor Road.
- ◆ At the September 21, 2015, Mayor and Council meeting, County Clerk John S. Hogan presented the Borough with copies of various historical documents. The display is available to be viewed in the Clerk's office.

AS THE SEASON CHANGES

Please advise your children to be careful on the way to and from school. Also, remind them not to play in the pile of leaves they find in our roadways. Related to leaves, please try to keep our storm drains clear to prevent flooding in your immediate area. I also invite you to take part in the numerous seasonal activities that will be taking place in Harrington Park, many are listed in this newsletter.

STUDENTS AND GOVERNMENT

During the month of October, I have planned several activities involving our grade school children. They will have the opportunity to take part in various events related to local and county government.

On October 6, 2015, the second grade class will visit Borough Hall and experience a hands-on-program that will teach them about municipal services. The Police Department, Department of Public Works, Volunteer Fire Department and Volunteer Ambulance Corps will be participating.

Later in the month, on October 19, 2015, the eighth grade members of the Student Government Association will actually take part in the Mayor and Council Meeting. We also are planning to take these students to Hackensack to be introduced to County government.

Hopefully, these types of activities will increase our student interest in the democratic process and encourage them to take a more active part in service to their town, county, State, and federal government.






