FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR'S DESK



TAXES DUE

Payment dates for property taxes are **August 1st, November 1st, February 1st,** and **May 1st**. There is always a ten-day grace period.

To utilize our online Tax Collector information on our borough website, just click on the link below to see your current tax amount, print bills, and see if your taxes have been paid or posted:

You can also, mail your tax payments or you can drop it off in the drop box at Borough Hall. If you require a receipt, please give us stamped self-addressed envelope, and we will mail it.

NJ ANCHOR (formerly the Homestead Rebate program)

If you filed an ANCHOR benefit application, the state will begin payments in late spring by either check or direct deposit.

Please note that the payments will not be in the form of credits to property tax bills. Those who filed an application may check on their status and amount being paid either online at https://www.state.nj.us/treasury/taxation/anchor/status.shtml or by phone at 1-877-658-2972.

SENIOR FREEZE:

The new 2022 PTR-1 and PTR-2 booklets are now available. If you have not received them in the mail, you may download them from the state's website: https://www.state.nj.us/treasury/tazxation/ptr/eligibility.shtml. The deadline for filing is October 31st, 2023.

- 3)Proof of rabies vaccination for each pet being licensed per State statute, current rabies vaccination must be valid through the end of October 2024. If the vaccination expires prior to this date your pet cannot be licensed and a late fee will be assessed each month until the rabies is renewed. If you have concerns about re-vaccinating prior to the current expiration date, please have your veterinarian contact us at 201-768-1700.

FIRE PREVENTION from Tom Simpson, Fire Marshal

Now that the cooler weather is here and you will be utilizing your heating system, please make sure that you do the following:

- 1. Have the unit serviced and the chimney cleaned and inspected.
- 2. Make sure your fireplace or wood stove is cleaned out and that the chimney has been inspected.
- 3. When cleaning out your fireplace or wood stove please make sure that you put the ashes into a metal container remove them from your house and place them away from your house. DO NOT PUT THEM IN PLASTIC BAGS.
- 4. Have all of your holiday lights inspected for bad wires. If found, discard them immediately.
- 5. If you are using live holiday decorations please make sure that you keep them watered to prevent drying out. If they are dry remove them from your home.
- 6. Please change the batteries in your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detector every six months. Now is the time to do it.

Some environmental tips as winter approaches:

- 1. Don't cut back your ornamental grasses and perennials until spring and let some dead leaves remain in garden beds. The seeds and leaves provide wintering sites for beneficial insects and butterflies.
- 2. Use LED lights on Christmas decorations both in and outdoors, as they draw less energy and are safer since they don't heat up.
- 3. Remember to remove all ornaments and plastic disposal bags from trees before discarding them at the curb.
