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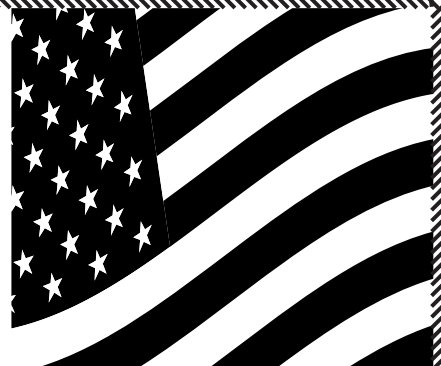

(Tuesdays June 1 and September 7 due to Monday holidays)

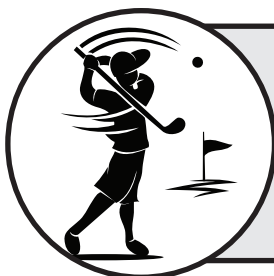


Recycling Collection

FIRE PREVENTION NEWS



Make sure smoke alarms are functioning properly and that batteries (except 10 year) have been replaced. Drain your snowblower and store the gas in a proper container. Check your propane gas grill for any broken hoses and make sure that there are no spider nests inside the hoses, which will cause your grill not to light. Shut off the gas to your grill when you are not using it.

If there is a fire hydrant located on your property and there are shrubs around it, please make sure the shrubs are cut back enough so that a firefighter is able to access the hydrant. A blocked hydrant can delay getting additional water to the fire. Thanks to those of you who shoveled out hydrants on your property.

Call 911 when there is an emergency in your home or business. Have a meeting place across the street from your home so that you know where your family is. Get out and Stay out.

Space is Limited. Registration is required.

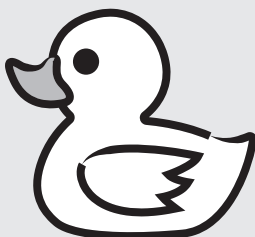

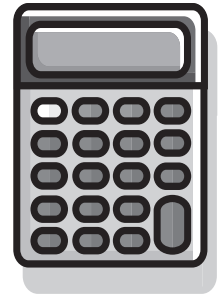
FROM THE TAX OFFICE

Taxes were due on May 1st 2021 and had a 10-day grace period. You can pay taxes online with a credit card or check. To pay Taxes online visit: <https://wipp.edmundsassoc.com/Wipp/?wippid=0224> .

The state of NJ has issued homestead credit that applied to the second quarter (May). This is a state-run program, so if you have any questions please call 1-888-238-1233 (the New Jersey Division of Taxation).

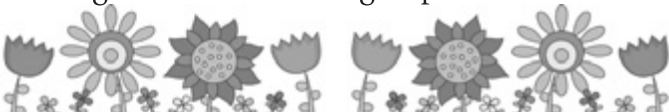

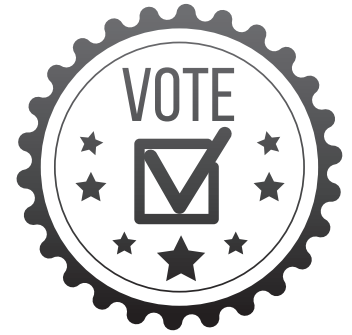
RESIDENTIAL CERTIFICATE OF CONTINUED OCCUPANCY REQUIRED

Any rental, lease, or sale for any residential use will require the owner to apply for and secure a Certificate of Continued Occupancy from the Building Department. The resulting inspection is in addition to the Smoke Detector/ Carbon Monoxide Certificate, also filed through the Building Department.

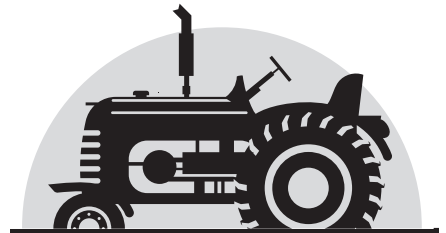
- June 1** – is the deadline to apply for a VOTE BY MAIL Ballot for the June Primary Election

Introduction of the Local Budget

Work on the Harrington municipal budget is near completion. It will be introduced in April and we hope passed in May of 2021. As of this writing, the local increase will be between \$85.00 and \$95.00 a year on the average property assessed at \$541.00 (rounded).

Please remember, the local portion of your taxes is approximately 20% of the total bill. The other 80% goes to the cost of County and School services.

Except for areas that are totally out of our control, every effort was made to hold the line on requested increases.

It Isn't Over Yet (COVID-19)

While great strides have taken place in our struggle with COVID-19, the battle is not over. We have seen increases in the number of active cases in Harrington Park. In a recent two-week period, there were 11 new cases reported.

As a result, please keep yourself and your family protected. Vaccines are increasingly available along with the standard recommendations of wearing face masks, social distancing and avoiding large crowds. If we work together, we can win this battle. The most recent numbers for Harrington Park from the Bergen County Office of Emergency Management are 314 cases. At this point, the Borough does not have an exact count for active cases (which have been substantially lower).

Hopefully Some Good News

Congressman William Pascrell, who represents Congressional District 9, "has introduced HR 946 calling for the full repeal of the SALT deductibility cap." Since 2017 homeowners have been limited to a \$10,000 deduction of state and local taxes (SALT). The New Jersey League of Municipalities is a strong supporter of removing this cap. If HR 946 becomes law it could have a positive impact on the taxes you pay to the federal government.

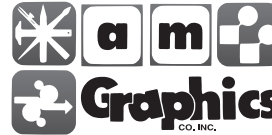
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
